

Teacher's Note

- Collect lots of recycled materials like: string, wool, paper, magazines, cotton wool, rice, dried beans or peas, al-foil, sweet wrappers, wood shavings, pencil rubbings, leaves, tiny pebbles, beads, cloth material, bits of leather etc.
- Have students finish the worksheet first before starting their collage. It will give them a few ideas as how to tackle the project.
- Students could make a collage on their own or work in pairs or make small groups and make large poster size collages.

Suggested Activities:

- ❖ Have students' collages on display at a local shopping centre. Promote your school at the same time.
- ❖ Visit a local art show where collages are on display.
- ❖ Try adding paints or sparkles on top of the collage for a different effect.
- ❖ Join all the students' collages on the wall to make one big one.
- ❖ Have a theme collage.
- ❖ Locate several library books dealing with collages to give students ideas on topics.
