

## *Teacher's Note*

- Help students understand that drawing in proportion will make their drawing look more realistic.
- Pull out old drawings and discuss if they were drawn in proportion or not.
- If you want students to practice drawing people in proportion, start with stick figures. These are easy to draw and proportion is easily identified.

### *Suggested Activities:*

- ❖ Take students outside for a drawing lesson. Ask them to draw a tree and something else underneath it in proportion. Can they give it perspective as well?
- ❖ Obtain books showing pictures of paintings. Discuss the perspective and how it is proportioned.
- ❖ Ask students to observe someone's face. Can they see where the ears start and finish in relation to the eyes and mouth? How wide apart are the eyes? What shape are the lips? How long is the neck etc.
- ❖ Use this worksheet in conjunction with the 'Perspective' worksheet.
