A conjunction joins
words and clauses.



Example: Eat the apple and the banana

The word 'and' is a conjunction.

There can be more than one conjunction in a sentence.

*Example: Eat the apple and the banana but
not the orange.*

The words 'and' + 'but' are conjunctions.
