

## *Teacher's Note*

### *Answers:*

- A) Walk the rest of the way.
  - B) Never swerve out onto the road even if no traffic is coming because this can lead to bad practices. Slow down and stay on the left of the foot/cycle path. You might have to stop and let the man and the dog go pass before continuing. This would be polite and safe for everyone.
  - C) Guide your horse away from the road. Talk to the animal or stroke it. If the horse is still very jumpy, get off and hold it tight by the reins, talking and reassuring the animal until the car is gone.
  - D) To alert other road users you are approaching them.
  - E) It is illegal and another passing vehicle might hit you. It is a distraction for other road users and could lead to accidents.
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- Please check student's drawing. If they walk to school they could draw some feet.

### *Suggested Activities:*

- ❖ Obtain more information from the Australian Road Safety Council, AAA Foundation for Traffic Safety, Federal Office of Road Safety, Transport Authorities, Local Police Station or library.
- ❖ Discuss the importance of obeying road rules and why students should behave while using public transport. Discuss how drivers can easily be distracted and accidents often happen because of this.
