

Answer Key – Fungi

Descriptions

- **Mushroom** - a fleshy fungus that consists of a cap at the end of a stem arising from an underground mycelium.
- **Toadstool** – They are a member of the Agaricales or Boletales and have an inedible fruiting body.
- **Mould** – a hairy type growth on the surface of organic matter caused by fungi, mainly presence in areas of dampness or decay.
- **Rust** – a plant disease that gives a rusty-like appearance to a plant and is characterised by the dense amounts of reddish-brown spores
- **Mildew** - a whitish-grey coating formed by fungi on plant leaves, cloth, paper, shower curtains, doors, walls etc.
- **Pathogen means:** Any organism capable of producing/causing disease in another organism.

Fungi pathogen examples:

Ringworm – skin infection

Bridle creeper rust

Outcomes:
